- Be patient at crossings.


Avoid distractions while driving.

This term, we have already covered several key lessons, which have had a positive impact on our students' behaviour in the classroom, on the playground, and when representing our school.

Well done everyone!

Week 1: Challenge Course: All students must be walked through the Challenge course before they can go on it. This is an OSH requirement.

Week 2: Our school wide HEART focus this week is/ has been based on the Whakatauki: He waka eke noa. We are all in this together! A canoe which we are all in with no exception. What is our shared vision in our classroom? in our school. How do we work well together.

Week 3: Our school wide HEART focus this week is/ has been based on the Whakatauki: I orea te tautara ka patu ki waho. A problem is solved by continuing to find solutions. As we have created our class matrix of agreed expectations we have looked at the need for creative thinking, adaptability and perseverance.


