

Year 8 Camp 2025

Dear Parents/Caregivers

Over the past few years, we have been lucky enough to take a large group of Year 8 students away to camp. In 2025 we will be going to the Tōtara Springs Christian Centre in Matamata.

Tōtara Springs is the largest centre of its kind in New Zealand and is the ultimate venue for school camps.

Date: Wednesday 29 October - Friday 31 October 2025

The camp cost is \$330

Our preferred method of payment is now through Kindo, you can create an account here through the QR Code or via our school website. This also includes the health form required for camp.

It could be useful to set up automatic payments into Kindo now. If paying \$16.50pw from 26th of July it would be paid off by the end of the school year.

To secure your child's place at camp, a \$100.00 non-refundable deposit must be paid by Friday 22nd November

The balance of the account must be paid by Friday 11 April 2025.

From the Ministry of Education

"Decile 1-7 state and state-integrated schools are able to choose to receive a \$150 per student, per year payment if they agree not to ask parents and caregivers for donations, except for overnight camps".

Pukekohe Intermediate has selected to claim the \$150 from the Ministry, therefore parents are required to pay camp costs. Attendance at our school camp is not mandatory, it is optional to send your child to camp. If you choose not to, school learning will continue as usual. The school will also help to remove any barriers to attending camp by working with families and

helping fund students where there is a need. Year 8 Camp, Please return this part to school even if your child is NOT attending camp.
