This week in our kura we celebrate Ake Ake Ake, the forever language te Reo Māori. Students gathered each morning for the raising of the Maori flag and to sing waiata. Classes are learning the origins of te reo and how the language has evolved to be part of who we are in Aotearoa.

Our Māori leaders visited the Franklin Library to learn about the places where the Treaty was signed in Auckland “Te Tiriti ki Tāmaki Makurau”.

Students were able to use Virtual Reality technology and interact with a large map of Auckland seeing where their waka arrived. Staff engaged in a te reo focussed staff meeting on Monday learning Maori games that our kapa haka group use.

Our staff also learnt a new waiata which has been written and gifted to the region by mana whenua. We are also welcoming Pukekohe High School and Pukekohe Hill School kapa haka performance groups on Friday to collaborate with a mass kapa haka performance.

### Year 8 Assembly

During the Year 8 Assembly, our students were fortunate to listen to our guest speaker, William Pike. He shared his inspiring story of overcoming challenges, his passion for the outdoors, and the personal growth he experienced by stepping out of his comfort zone.
