Inquiry Learning

Last term in Lomu we had a focus on The World of Competition. The students did an inquiry into whether Sports and Competition have been shaped by Innovation over time.

We looked at the history of the Olympics, the Opening Ceremony, the Values that underpin the Olympics and the need for change in sports. They were then given this challenge: You are a group of 3-4 architects employed by the Auckland City Council.

They have tasked you with designing a sports complex to house a potential upcoming sports event –the 2030 Commonwealth Games.

As a team, you need to follow the inquiry process to create a model for part of the wider grounds. They were also given a list of the required complexes and some rules that needed to be followed. We finished with a showcase of the stadium models which you can see here.
